Sisters Hope has been chosen to manifest ***Sensuous Governing***, as a part of the Edinburgh Festival Fringe this year. They will explore the future of governance through the a poetic artistic intervention during August as part of Summerhall's Fringe programme.

Sensuous Governing is an immersive and otherworldly journey into the governing structures of our society. During the manifestation you will explore your poetic self – as well as hopes and dreams for a potential future society called **Sensuous Society**, a new world where everything is governed by the principles of the aesthetic dimension. During the manifestation audiences will meet several of the Sisters Hope performers who will guide and facilitate them on this journey.

Sisters Hope is a highly acclaimed and award-winning Copenhagen-based performance group and movement spearheading a whole new wave of performance artwork inspiring generations to come. They operate at the intersection of performance art, research, activism and pedagogy. They draw on immersion and intervention when they manifest on the stages of everyday life and beyond aiming at democratizing and unfolding the aesthetic dimension.

Sisters Hope said: *"We must inhabit the art, not just visit or participate temporarily"*

NOTES TO EDITORS

Sisters Hope is a highly acclaimed and award-winning Copenhagen-based performance group and movement spearheading a new way of performance artwork inspiring new generations. Their work unfolds at the intersection of immersion, intervention, interactivity, activism, research, and pedagogy. In their large-scale durational performances, they explore different aspects of what they call a Sensuous Society – A potential new world arising from the post-economic, ecological and social crisis. See also TEDx talks on Sisters Hope *Sensuous Society* and *Sensuous Learning*. In their complex performative manifestations, they are introducing a new artistic paradigm that they term 'Inhabitation' stimulating ecologic connectedness for sustainable futures. Sisters Hope has furthermore developed their own performance method – Sisters Performance Method – Sensuous Learning, which is the outset of the training of Sisters Hope performers and which is now taught widely at art schools, and beyond, around the world. Sisters Hope is led by Gry Worre Hallberg who co-founded the group with her poetic twin sister Anna Lawaetz in 2007.
